




ACTION (EMA/ECORD Council): to write an official letter to the Japanese stating the concerns about the *Chikyu* situation. It should be mentioned that ECORD paid already twice but that there was no expedition and that ECORD expects a new evaluation of the number of ECORD scientists for the next expedition which is expected to take place in 2016.

Letter to Taira-san (June 7th, 2015)

- ✓ ECORD will suspend its membership of the Chikyu program for at least two years, 2015 and 2016
- ✓ 2014 ECORD membership fee might cover ECORD's participation to the 2016 engineering Chikyu expedition if there is a sufficient number of ECORD scientists involved in the scientific program; if not, our 2014 membership fee would cover ECORD's participation to the next Chikyu IODP expedition which is tentatively planned in 2017










Number of DSDP-, ODP-, and IODP related non-Program publications based on first author affiliation (2003-2014)
