IODP Expedition 357: Atlantis Massif Serpentinization & Life

- Offshore phase: 26 Oct- 11 Dec
- **Cored interval:** 0 16.5 mbsf at 9 sites
- Cored length: 57 m
- Core recovery: 53%
- Deployment of borehole packer and plug systems
 - **OSP:** 20 Jan 5 Feb

- High quality cores recovered
- Moderate recovery
- Successful use of new sensor assembly
- Successful use of new tracer pump
- Successful use of new water samplers
- Technically challenging expedition
- Seafloor drill technical advancements were made
- New core and data collected from lithologies not seen before
- New scientific discoveries are anticipated
- Seafloor drill performance is under review
- RD2 is being used for part of the Blue Mining Project, to core and characterise massive sulphide deposits on the Mid Atlantic Ridge (Jul-Aug 2016)

- **Cored interval:** 505.7 1334.7 mbsf
- Cored length: 838.2 m

- **CT Scanning (Weatherford):** June
- **OSP:** 21 Sep mid Oct

- Peak ring target reached
- Successful collaboration with ICDP
- Successful cooperation with Mexico
- No H&S/environmental incidents
- Huge media interest worldwide
- Documentary team given access
- Moratorium articles in preparation
