

The ECORD-NSF Memorandum of Understanding has been signed over summer 2014!

After long months of completion, the ECORD-NSF Memorandum of Understanding has been eventually signed over this summer. ECORD is now officially a member of the *JOIDES Resolution* Consortium of the IODP during the period October 1st, 2013 – September 30th, 2019. During this period, the ECORD funding will be of US\$ 7 M annually within the limits of available funds.

ECORD may elect to (1) send up to eight ECORD scientists on each *JOIDES Resolution* expedition, (2) have fourteen voting representatives on the Science Evaluation Panel, (3) have four voting representatives on the Environmental Protection and Safety Panel, and have one member on the *JOIDES Resolution* Facility Board.

The *JOIDES Resolution* Consortium members may elect to send up to thirteen scientists, i.e. eight US scientists and five scientists from other members, on each Mission-specific platform expedition. Each member of the *JOIDES Resolution* Consortium may have one formal member on the ECORD Facility Board and may send additional representatives as observers to the ECORD Facility Board meetings.
